

## Some Good News

Good morning Stephen,

A quick update on the status of where we are with the importation of PPMV1. We have received support from both the State CVO and Commonwealth CVO they both support the fast tracking of the registration of PPMV1. Please be aware even with the support of these two government bodies the quickest way to achieve the importation of the vaccine is to have an emergency permit issued. We believe this is not too far off. (note vaccine must comply with the AQIS strict import standards - no exceptions)

Our EU Dossier is being couriered to Australia next week. As soon as we receive this information the registration processes will commence. In the mean time we are checking to see if the antigen used to manufacture our last batch of PPMV1 has been made to the Australian standard. If it is we will be a step closer to being able to import vaccine. If its not, a new batch of antigen will need to be made and tested when/if the antigen is approved we can then make the vaccine. The second alternative could take up to 4 - 5 months.

But at least we are in a better position to import vaccine than we were 2 weeks ago.
